Discussion: James Sayen (Moderator) called Town Meeting to Order at 10:00 am. Moderator askes all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance; Recognizes all Veterans for their service to our country and asks them to stand for recognition; Recognizes Town election officials for their dedication to the Town; Discusses the need for more people to become involved with Town Meeting and Elections both politically and as volunteers. Moderator opens and displays empty Ballot Box and then secures Ballot Box. Moderator explains the rules of the house regarding professional conduct and mutual respect during Town meeting dialogues.

Moderator moves to Warrant Articles.

- Tim Brooks questions Line Item 4210-4214 presenting that the budget was not reduced even though only a small portion was used the previous year. Clayton Macdonald responded with regards to the contract with the NH State Troopers and a need for contingency funds since the Town chose not to disband the Police Department during Town Meeting 2017 and that if a qualified person were to apply for the position at any time, the Town would need funds to pay for new police staff.
- Claire Martineau questions as to where the unused Police Dept. funds go at the end of the year. Clayton Macdonald responds that they are then added to the Unassigned Fund Balance where excess funds are used, in part, to reduce the tax burden on the Town's tax payers for the following tax cycles.
- Racheal O'Meara questions why the Town Clerk & Tax Collector's budget increased by ~\$25,000.00, Josiah Barnes (Town Clerk & Tax Collector) explains that in previous years, the TC/TC salary, Election Payroll portion of the budget was under "Executive" and NOT under its own budgeting. The TC/TC felt that it made more sense to have all things under the TC/TC's umbrella to be on the TC/TC Budget. This was not an increase in the TC/TC budget as it was reorganization of the Town Budget in general. Vicki Delalla, also responds that there are 2 elections in 2018 whereas there were 0 elections and only Town Meeting in 2017.

- Tim Brooks would rather have the money go to the active fire dept. and disagrees with holding out money for a non-active police dept.
- Vicki Delalla discusses how unexpended money goes to tax relief.
- Rachel O'Meara asks if the town is ever going to hire for the police department. Clayton responds that Select-Board needs more input from the town.
- James Davis brings up that we have had hearings on regarding the Police Dept and encourages more people to be involved in the hearing.
- Denis Corbeil asks how many hours per week that the state troopers patrol,
 James Davis responds 4 hours per week.
- Mark Mccullock ask about the monthly pay to State Troopers.
- Claire suggests that police fund goes more towards state police to help increase their coverage in Stratford. Clayton responds.
- Marc Mccullock discusses issues with Northern Pass and the Balsams Project; If there is any more news regarding The Balsams; and to give the police dept. another year before deciding.
- Charlie Goulet & James Davis discuss reasons for keeping the police budget.
- Chris Caron would like to have more hearings regarding the police dept.

Mark Mccullock wants to know who asked for this to which Wayne Hall Sr. responds that it was the Backroom Tavern. Mark also voices his support of the for this article since it does support our educational system just as the proceeds from the Liquor Commission does. Joe Skillen discusses how this would be a gateway for gambling in Stratford. He is concerned that this will be another temptation for people to lose their money gambling and that people in our region are already too poor to afford this. Rachel O'Meara addresses her concerns against the Keno Program stating that Concord should be putting more money towards education rather than receiving funds from gambling. Vicki Delalla asks for clarification as to what Keno is. Wayne Hall Sr. explains Keno. Mr. Hall goes on to explain why Keno can be a benefit and explains why Alarice Scott (Keno Sponsor) was unable to attend Town Meeting Laws regarding where Keno may be dispensed and/or played are clarified.
